


Vision


About Yuva Mitra

Registered under the Bombay Public Charitable Trust Act, 1950, the Societies Registration Act, 1860, and the Foreign Contribution (Regulation) Act, Yuva Mitra began its journey by focusing on children's development through the Balmitra program. This initiative aimed to enhance life skills in rural children by creating engaging learning environments in villages like Ramnagar and Jamgaon of the Sinnar Block. Concurrently, the Nisarg Mitra project was launched to safeguard village biodiversity and the environment, with active participation from the children.

Over the years, Yuva Mitra has expanded its efforts across four key thematic areas: Water Resources Development and Management, Livelihood Development, Institution Building, and Health and Education. The organization's approach is deeply rooted in community participation, working closely with people to address their needs and empowering them to drive social change. 



OVERVIEW OF WATER RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT VERTICAL

In the current financial year, Yuva Mitra has made remarkable progress in its Water Conservation vertical, implementing a wide range of projects across different regions, including Atal Bhujal Yojana, Jal Jeevan Mission, Jalkavach, L&T Jal Samvardhan, TATA Autocomp, and SGP. These initiatives have focused on improving water security, promoting efficient water management practices, and enhancing sustainable agriculture. Through these projects, Yuva Mitra engaged local communities in developing critical water infrastructure by desilting water bodies, constructing and repairing irrigation systems, and promoting conservation techniques.

This financial year, over 1,17,752 households have gained improved access to water, and **6,46,597 cubic meters** of additional water storage capacity have been generated. This year, **430 water conservation** structures were successfully developed, including Cement Nala Bunds (CNBs), gabion structures, and solar-based irrigation systems, while **5,000+** community members received training on sustainable water and agricultural practices. These efforts have fostered resilience in rural communities and contributed to enhanced agricultural productivity and water resource management.

Since its inception in 2007, Yuva Mitra's Water Conservation vertical has emerged as a crucial player in addressing global water scarcity, fostering agricultural sustainability, and supporting rural livelihoods. Supported by CSR partners and government programs, Yuva Mitra has led transformational projects, including the Diversion-Based Irrigation (DBI) project and the Jalsamruddhi Water Security Program, which have collectively impacted 1,430 villages and 1,17,752 households. Over the years, 6.9 million cubic meters of water storage capacity have been added through desilting efforts and the construction of new structures, significantly improving water recharge and irrigation. The projects have enabled the restoration of over 1,53,527 acres of land for agriculture, transforming barren areas and increased the agricultural output. Additionally, Yuva Mitra has formed 204 Water User Groups (WUGs) to manage water resources sustainably and enhanced water recharging among 25,060 wells and borewells from these interventions.

Key achievements of the Water Conservation vertical include pioneering efforts in the Diversion-Based Irrigation (DBI) project, which brought 3,094 hectares of land under assured irrigation and raised groundwater levels by 10-12 feet, benefiting 2,376 families. Similarly, the Jalsamruddhi Water Security Program increased water storage capacity by 7 million cubic meters, covering over 400 desilted sites, and indirectly benefiting 40,000 farmers. Through these initiatives, Yuva Mitra has successfully driven socio-economic upliftment and agricultural revitalization across Nashik and surrounding regions.





JAL KAVACH PROJECT OVERVIEW

ONGOING PROJECTS OF FY 2023-2024

Project Title: Improving Water Recharge Potential through Water Augmentation in

Nashik & Aurangabad (Maharashtra) and Dhar District (Madhya Pradesh)

Funded By: Glenmark Foundation

Areas of Operation: 29 Villages, Nashik, Aurangabad, and Dhar

The "Jal Kavach" project addresses significant challenges in water management across the highly undulating regions of Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh, where climate variation and severe soil erosion from high runoffs limit agricultural productivity. In regions where 80% of farming is rainfed, summer months see severe water shortages, affecting crop yields and green fodder availability. Through strategic water augmentation efforts, Yuva Mitra and the Glenmark Foundation are creating sustainable water recharge systems. The project focuses on desilting water bodies, constructing gabion structures, and farm pond recharge activities, ensuring that communities across 29 villages can manage their water resources effectively. These interventions are crucial for maintaining water availability during critical summer months and ensuring agricultural sustainability.

Project Objectives

 To create water recharge potential through water augmentation measures in water-scarce regions.

Combined Impact for Maharashtra and Madhya Pradesh

The project has significantly improved water resource management across both states, impacting 3,471 farmers and enhancing irrigation for 2,239 hectares of land. Some of the major outcomes include:

- Total Water Storage Capacity Created: from de-silt 664,912.24 cubic meters (66.49 crore liters)
- Total Recharge Potential Created: 398,947.34
 cubic meters
- Wells Recharged: Over 1,035 wells
- Farmers Benefited: 3,471 farmers

The collective work of Village Watershed Committees (VWCs), made up of local representatives, has helped ensure that these water management interventions continue to provide long-term benefits to the communities.

Need of the Program

Hydro-Geophysical Report for Aquifer Mapping and Groundwater Recharge Zones

The hydro-geophysical investigation was conducted to address the persistent challenge of declining groundwater levels in project villages, exacerbated by erratic rainfall and inadequate soil and water conservation practices. The report emphasizes the conservation and management of both surface 8 groundwater resources, with a focus on creating self-sustaining groundwater recharge systems.

- Geological and lithological mapping

- Hydrogeological mapping and aquifer identification
- Identification of groundwater recharge potential zones

Establishment and Monitoring of Observation Wells:

STORY OF CHANGE THROUH WATER CONSERVATION

Transformation of Thakarwadi: A Story of Hope and Renewal Thakarwadi ENB, Jaulake BK Village

Thakar Vasti, a small hamlet of Jaulake BK Gram Panchayat, faced severe water scarcity for years. The village's seepage pond had fallen into disrepair, clogged with 2,670 cubic meters of silt. Every summer, the wells would dry up, forcing villagers to walk 4-5 kilometers to fetch water. Many families even migrated to escape the harsh conditions.



Seeing so much water in the lake, it feels like the burden of water on our heads has been lifted. I feel very satisfied knowing that the water level in our wells has increased because of this.

Due to the deepening of the lake, the rain water is getting accumulated in it, so the water coming from the mountains used to accumulate and damage our farm, but that water has been saved from damage to our farm Raju Jadhav, Farmer, Thakarwasti

In response to this crisis, TATA Autocomp, with the support of TATA Water Mission and Yuva Mitra, launched an ambitious project to revive the seepage pond. The collective effort involved removing the accumulated silt and repairing the lake. The impact was almost immediate. The water levels in the wells began to rise, signalling a positive change and a hopeful future for the village.

Thanks to these collaborative efforts, Thakar Vasti is now prepared to face the summer months with confidence, their water needs assured. The once-neglected percolated lake has been transformed into a vibrant source of life that nourishes the village and its people.



STORY OF CHANGE THROUH MINI DENSE FOREST



Miyawaki Plantation: A rapid creation of mini forest in rural areas to enhance biodiversity

In 2023, Yuva Mitra partnered with Tata AutoComp and Tata Trust to embark on an innovative journey towards combating climate change through afforestation. Together, they launched the Miyawaki Plantation initiative in the hamlet of Mandlewadi, located in Wafgaon village of Pune's Khed block. The project aimed to create a dense, biodiverse forest using the Miyawaki method a revolutionary technique pioneered by Japanese botanist Dr. Akira Miyawaki.

The Miyawaki method, unique for its rapid growth and dense afforestation, was applied on a 500-square-meter plot, where 500 saplings from 216 different native species were planted. These saplings, placed close to each other, grew quickly into a lush forest, providing numerous environmental benefits. The preparation of the soil using organic materials such as jeevamrut ensured that the plants thrived. The community played a crucial role, becoming involved in the process from the outset through awareness campaigns, and a local person was appointed to monitor and care for the forest in its early stages. Over two years, this dense forest developed into a self-sustaining ecosystem.



The Miyawaki forest at Mandlewadi now stands as a witness to what is possible when we unite to tackle global challenges like climate change. Through this project, Yuva Mitra has taken another step toward addressing global environmental issues, making the world a little greener and more resilient for future generations.

The initiative is aimed at ensuring water security while promoting socio-economic development within the tribal community

Project Objectives:

- Water Security: Ensure a steady water supply for agriculture, plantations, and drinking purposes.
- Increase Income: Boost the income of marginal farmers by enhancing irrigation and adopting improved agricultural practices.
- Sustainable Natural Resource Management: Build the community's capacity to sustainably manage their natural resources.

Through the Jal Samvardhan Project, significant strides have been made in increasing water security and empowering communities with the skills and knowledge needed to sustainably manage water resources, contributing to the overall well-being of tribal households.





Key Achievements:

- Developed comprehensive water security plans for all five villages.
- Desilted existing water bodies, including percolation tanks and deepened nalas, creating 8,700 cubic meters of additional water storage capacity.
- Organized 10 training and capacity-building events on water management and agriculture across the five villages.

Outcomes and Impact:

- Water Storage: The project generated 8,700 cubic meters of water storage capacity, improving water availability for agricultural and domestic needs.
- Enhanced Awareness: Local farmers gained critical knowledge on efficient water management practices, leading to improved water conservation and utilization.

Revitalizing Farmland through Water Conservation



Kalusing Vesta Valvi, a 55-year-old farmer from Malpur village, saw his land's fertility decline due to soil erosion, leading to poor crop yields. Despite using organic fertilizers, the results were unsatisfactory. The Jal Samvardhan Project by Yuva Mitra and L&T Technology Services brought hope. Through desiltation, nutrient-rich silt were distributed across 9 acres of farmland, including Kalusing's 2-acre plot. This improved soil fertility and water retention, allowing Kalusing to plant maize, expecting a profit of Rs. 30,000. The project also raised groundwater levels, ensuring a more reliable water supply for the community. Kalusing expressed deep gratitude, believing this initiative will secure farmers' livelihoods for the future.

OVERVIEW OF THE LIVELIHOOD AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT

At Yuva Mitra, our Livelihood and Skill Development vertical forms the cornerstone of our rural empowerment strategy. Since 2012, we have been working to uplift marginalized and remote communities by enhancing income opportunities and promoting socio-economic progress. Our initiatives align with key Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly SDG 1, SDG 2 and SDG 5.

This vertical focuses on the sustainable development of rural communities by leveraging agriculture, water management, and land development, alongside applied education through community institution building. We emphasize creating diversified livelihood opportunities, especially for women and vulnerable populations, ensuring a path to economic stability and self-reliance.

Key Livelihood Projects and Impacts

Goat-Based Livelihood Initiative (2015-Present)

In partnership with BAGIC, RCT, HTPF, Lakhpati Kisan, and BFL, Yuva Mitra has transformed goat farming into a sustainable livelihood for over 17,025 families in 160 villages across Nandurbar, Nashik, and Ahmednagar districts. By supporting 2,840 Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) and facilitating a total goat population of 106,440+, we have drastically reduced the mortality rate of goats from 17.75% to 2.66%, contributing to significant income stability for rural families. This ongoing initiative has helped to create resilient income streams, directly impacting household well-being and local economies.







Skill Development for Women

In an effort to empower rural women and girls, Yuva Mitra initiated a skill development project in 2019 with the support of KSB Pumps Ltd. The project began as a four-month fashion designing course aimed at helping women acquire practical skills and achieve financial independence. The first phase trained 30 women, each of whom received a sewing machine to start their own businesses. These women now earn between Rs. 4,000 and 6,000 per month, significantly supporting their families.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, these women stepped up and produced face masks for frontline workers, medical staff, and the local administration. Their efforts not only provided a much-needed service during the crisis but also demonstrated their socio-economic empowerment and resilience.

Building on the success of the initial project, Yuva Mitra expanded the program in FY 2023-24 to include vocational training in beauty services, further diversifying the opportunities for around 160 women in the Sinnar block of Maharashtra. By offering both fashion design and beauty services training, the project has fostered entrepreneurship, enhanced employability, and created new income opportunities for women. This expansion has helped stimulate local economies, reduce poverty, and contribute to regional economic growth, with many women now successfully operating their own businesses.

Integrated Village Development Program

In collaboration with Apraava Energy Pvt. Ltd., Yuva Mitra successfully implemented the IVDP in Sakri Block of Dhule District, Maharashtra. This program delivered holistic development by executing over **2,900 watershed** treatments benefiting **1,200+ families**, establishing 10 Village Development Committees, and facilitating more than **400 farm field school** sessions. By addressing education, water access, and infrastructure, this initiative reinforced the foundation for rural prosperity.

Lakhpati Kisan Project

The Lakhpati Kisan Project aims to uplift over **6,000+** tribal families by doubling their annual income from Rs. 30,000 to Rs. 60,000. This goal is being achieved through high-value crop diversification and the introduction of advanced farming techniques such as drip irrigation, the Trellis system, and solar-powered irrigation. The project emphasizes integrated water management and soil conservation to ensure sustainable agricultural practices. Additionally, community-led Water User Groups have been formed to promote responsible water usage. A focus on strengthening village institutions and empowering women in business management is driving long-term economic resilience and creating a more prosperous future for these communities.





GOAT-BASED LIVELIHOOD: EMPOWERING WOMEN AND COMMUNITIES

The Goat-Based Livelihood Project, initiated in 2021 with the support of the Rambha Charitable Trust, has emerged as a transformative initiative in the Sinnar block of Nashik district. This project focuses on empowering women through sustainable goat farming, fostering economic independence, and promoting environmental conservation. Over the past three years, the project has seen remarkable growth in both the goat population and the economic well-being of the beneficiaries. It has significantly enhanced the livelihoods of many women, establishing a sustainable model for economic development and community empowerment.

Key Achievements

JLG: The project formed **445 JLGs** involving **2,225** women, enabling access to project services for 2,050 women. Monthly village meetings engaged **5,649** members in reviewing work, planning activities, and promoting continuous learning.

Traininas:

- 40 village-level JLG training sessions involved 1,115 members covering goat business, vermicomposting, silage prep, and vaccination.
- Financial literacy sessions engaged 1,971
 members on saving, expenditure, investment
 principles, and government insurance schemes like
 Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Bima Yojana and Atal
 Pension Yojana.

Veterinary Care: 7,434 goats received veterinary care through Pashusakhis, reducing mortality rates and promoting vaccination. **29,088 goats** were vaccinated in 20 villages against various diseases, improving overall health and productivity.

Goat Insurance: Information on goat insurance was regularly provided, resulting in **546 goats** being insured for a sum assured of INR 5000, providing financial protection to the farmers.

Women's Melawa event:

- Attended by 641 women goat rearers
- Discussed women's economic empowerment, cybercrime awareness, health, and rights advocacy
- Showcased increasing involvement and empowerment of women

Business Management Training:

- Provided specialized training for 67 JLG members
- Enhanced skills in managing goat farming businesses

The Goat-Based Livelihood Enhancement Project aims to improve the socio-economic status of marginalized communities in Akole Block, Maharashtra. By emphasizing the empowerment of women, financial literacy, and market access for goat products, the project addresses critical challenges such as high goat mortality, inadequate infrastructure, and limited market access. Utilizing the Pashusakhi model and modern goat-rearing techniques, the project fosters sustainable livelihoods and community resilience.



JLG Formed

• Successfully formed 410 Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) with 2,050 women, improving access to project services and promoting collective empowerment through monthly meetings on goat health, vaccination, and financial literacy.

Trainings and Exposure Visits:

- Delivered thorough training on goat business management, with hands-on demonstrations in vermicomposting and silage preparation, empowering 1,751 members.
- Organized exposure trips for 199 JLG leaders at MPKV Rahuri, enriching their understanding of goat business and rearing techniques.

Veterinary Services:

Delivered veterinary services, improving goat health and reducing mortality. Treated 1,706 goats during the year.

- Vaccination Camps: Conducted deworming, PPR, and vaccination camps in 20 villages, resulting in 13,959 goats being vaccinated.
- Pashusakhi Model: Established a dedicated team
 of Pashusakhis providing essential first aid and
 vaccination services to goats, ensuring timely
 healthcare.

Economic Security:

- Goat Insurance: Insured 331 goats, with six claims submitted and three approved, totaling Rs. 15,000, offering financial protection.
- Asset Building: 253 goats purchased by JLG members, boosting assets for 102 families, and improved goat sheds for 190 families enhanced rearing practices.

Sustainable Practices: Distributed 13 Chaff Cutter cum Ata Chakki machines, held 214 fodder demonstrations, and promoted organic farming through 60 vermicomposting demos.










STORY OF CHANGE

A Journey of Struggle and Success

Beneficiary's Name: Laxmibai Lakshman Bendkule Chandgirwadi, Tal. Akole, Dist. Ahmednagar

Laxmibai Lakshman Bendkule, a resilient woman from Chandgirwadi village, Akole Taluka, Ahmednagar district, is an inspiring example of how determination, support, and courage can transform lives. Living with her husband, Laxmibai owns just 1 acre of farmland, but the income it provided was not enough to sustain their household. Fifteen years ago, she decided to supplement their income by venturing into goat farming.

However, goat farming came with its own set of challenges. The changing weather conditions—monsoons, scorching summers, and freezing winters—made it difficult to ensure the safety of her goats. The shortage of fodder and the constant threat from wild animals, especially when grazing in the hills, added to her worries.



One fateful day, while grazing her goats in the nearby forest, a leopard attacked one of her goats. Laxmibai acted fearlessly and managed to rescue the goat from the leopard's grasp. Although the goat was badly injured, Laxmibai didn't give up. She immediately sought help from Yuva Mitra's local animal caretaker, also known as the Pashu Sakhi, who provided first aid and quickly contacted the organization's veterinarian, Dr. Bajirao Mandlik.

Although the goat's chances of survival seemed slim, the Yuva Mitra team was committed to saving it. For four days, the vet and Pashu Sakhi administered continuous care. To Laxmibai's relief, the goat recovered fully, and within a month, it gave birth to two healthy kids.

Reflecting on the experience, Laxmibai said, "During that incident, not just one goat but three lives were saved." She is deeply grateful to Yuva Mitra and their partner, Bajaj Finance Limited, for their timely intervention.

Chhaya Jagtap's Transformation Through Goat Farming

Beneficiary Name: Chhaya Kacharu Jagtap: from Mendhi, Taluka: Sinnar, District: Nashik

Chhaya Jagtap, from Mendhi village, has transformed her life through goat farming. After leaving school due to financial difficulties, she and her husband worked as laborers while leasing a 4-acre plot of land. They began cattle farming and slowly expanded their herd to seven cows, which helped them educate their children and arrange a wedding for their daughter.

Chhaya received a goat from her mother but faced challenges with goat farming. With Yuva Mitra's support, she shifted focus to goats, learning about vaccinations, veterinary care, and fodder management. She built a shelter and storage with a ₹20,000 revolving fund and produced vermicompost from goat manure.

In the past two years, Chhaya has sold 24 male goats and now has 42 goats. She aims to grow her herd to 100 goats within the next three years.







KILL DEVELOPMENT THROUGH FASHION DESIGNING AND **BEAUTY PARLOUR COURSE**

The "Skill Development through Fashion Designing and Beauty Parlor Course" project, funded by KSB CARE CHARITABLE TRUST, was a transformative initiative aimed at creating livelihood opportunities for women in the burgeoning fashion and beauty industries. The project targeted women from Sinnar block and surrounding villages, focusing on providing vocational trainings, Soft Skill trainings and Exposure visits to enhance their skills, employability, and entrepreneurial potential.

This initiative empowers women by breaking traditional barriers and providing opportunities for skill development and economic independence. Through creativity, innovation, and business acumen, the program helps women achieve their aspirations and contribute to their families and communities.

- Trained 160 women, who were divided into two groups focusing on fashion design and beauty parlor skills.
- Delivered a comprehensive curriculum that covered garment construction, pattern making, skincare, haircare, makeup techniques, and salon management.
- Ensured a 100% certification rate, with graduates receiving joint certification from Yuva Mitra and KSB Care Charitable Trust.
- Facilitated networking and partnership opportunities, which helped participants secure employment or start their own businesses.







Empowering Silence: Pratibha Daware's Journey to Success

Under the Skill Development through Fashion Designing and Beauty Parlour Course, supported by KSB Care, Yuva Mitra achieved something truly unique: they empowered a woman who cannot speak to build a livelihood and transform her life.

Pratibha Gorakh Daware, a 30-year-old resident of Konambe village, faced immense challenges due to her inability to speak, as did her husband. Despite these obstacles, Pratibha had a desire to work and contribute to her family's income, but her disability limited her opportunities. The thought of starting a sewing business crossed her mind, yet the high cost of such training held her back.



Pratibha worked diligently, learning dressmaking, sewing, and blouse stitching, all within three months. Despite the challenges, she persisted and successfully completed the course. With her newfound skills, Pratibha launched her own business, proving that even in the face of adversity, success is possible.

Yuva Mitra and KSB Care's support not only provided Pratibha with essential vocational skills but also inspired her to consider furthering her education in fashion design. Pratibha's story is a testament to the power of empowerment, and a shining example of Yuva Mitra's mission to transform lives, regardless of barriers.



WADI PROJECT OVERVIEW

Project Funded By: NABARD under the Tribal Development Fund

Areas of Operation: Nandurbar Block, Nandurbar District, Maharashtra **Total Beneficiaries:** 200 (164 Male, 36 Female) across 10 villages

The WADI (orchard) project, initiated by NABARD and implemented by Yuva Mitra, is a comprehensive socio-economic rehabilitation initiative aimed at transforming wastelands into productive orchards. The project targets 450 small and marginal farmers, along with 50 landless individuals from Scheduled Tribes, in the Nandurbar block of Maharashtra. By promoting horticulture, forestry, and vegetable cultivation, the project seeks to enhance the livelihoods of these communities through sustainable agriculture and allied activities. The project's holistic approach includes water resource development, social and health programs, capacity building, and training, focusing on creating a diversified portfolio of income-generating activities.



Key Achievements

Horticulture Plantation & Maintenance:

Outcome: 200 farmers prepared 50 pits each for mango and guava plants, filled with a nutrient-rich mix. Seedlings were planted and are being actively nurtured.

Water Resource Development:

Outcome: Distribution of 200-litre plastic drums to all 200 farmers for irrigation and organic pesticide preparation. Drip irrigation units were provided to 173 farmers, petrol engines to 25, and submersible pumps to 2 farmers.

Vegetable Cultivation:

Outcome: Farmers participating in the WADI project earned an additional income of approximately Rs. 30,000 each from the cultivation of Wal Papdi vegetables.

Health Program:

Outcome: Two health camps were conducted, benefiting 242 individuals. Additionally, two health awareness sessions on waterborne diseases, nutrition, and primary care reached 240 participants.





WAGE IMPROVEMENTS IN SEED HYBRIDS (WISH)

Project Funded By: Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO) / Dutch Ministry of Economic Affairs.

Areas of Operation: Buldhana and Jalna District, Maharashtra



The WISH project, launched in August 2021, is a collaboration between Arisa and multinational seed companies BASF and Syngenta. This four-year project aims to address child labor and ensure minimum wage compliance in the vegetable seed sector in Karnataka and Maharashtra.

The project is divided into two phases. The first phase, completed in early 2022, involved research to identify areas where wages are below the legal minimum and where child labor persists. The second phase which Yuva Mitra focus on implementing strategies to tackle these issues by addressing their root causes.

Yuva Mitra's WISH Strateg

The project focuses on:



 Raising awareness on legal minimum wage, child labor, gender issues, financial inclusion, and grievance mechanisms with supply chain actors;



on these issues;Improving involved seed companies' policies for minimum wage compliance;

Engaging stakeholders at various levels



 Involving other seed companies and international federations to enhance industry-wide minimum wage compliance.

Expectations

BASF and Syngenta, along with other seed companies, will enhance internal policies for minimum wage compliance, including reviewing procurement price calculation, digitalization, wage recording, and monitoring. The WISH initiative aims to involve international seed federations to enhance sectorwide minimum wage adherence.

Farmers and growers supplying to BASF and Syngenta are required to undergo training on legal wage, child labor, and gender issues. They must comply with the companies' codes of conduct by verifying workers' ages, paying fair wages, and documenting work hours and salaries.

Benefits for farmers and labours

Paying minimum wages helps seed growers and farmers comply with labor laws, avoid legal issues, and align with industry standards. Fair wages enhance productivity, motivation, worker retention, living conditions, and workforce stability.

Labourers benefit from WISH project by participating in capacity building training to understand legal wage, labor, and gender issues, leading to increased income, improved living standards, and reduced child labor.

The Lakhpati Kisan Project aims to enhance household incomes through agricultural and irrigation development, goat-based livelihoods, and institution building in 40 tribal villages in Maharashtra. Funded by Shabari Adivasi Vitta Va Vikas Mahamandal, this three-year initiative targets 6000 households, with 4562 tribal households covered to date.

Objectives:

- Develop agricultural clusters in 40 villages to uplift tribal families.
- Increase family incomes from ₹30,000 to ₹60,000 per year through agriculture-based interventions.
- Stabilize agricultural production with improved irrigation and technology.
- Build and strengthen community institutions for effective market access and development.
- Promote tribal entrepreneurship and enhance local agricultural value chains.
- Create networks of trained tribal youth workers to support community development.

Achievements:

- Agriculture Development: Installed drip systems on 350 acres, enhancing vegetable production with trellis systems for 476 households. This increased average family income by ₹98,450 and improved vegetable yields, raising incomes by ₹55,780 for 476 farmers.
- Water Conservation & Irrigation Development:
 Developed 20 group wells, installed 7 solar-based irrigation systems, and equipped 20 borewells.
 Constructed 96 gabion and 199 loose boulder structures. These efforts resulted in seasonal income increases of up to ₹50,380 for 115 beneficiaries and ₹73,780 for 36 beneficiaries using solar systems.
- Livestock Development: Conducted vaccination camps and provided veterinary services across 155 hamlets. Inducted 77 Osmanabadi bucks and purchased 427 goats, training 1,708 beneficiaries through 26 sessions. Created 220 Joint Liability Groups (JLGs) and conducted 90 village-level trainings, benefiting 3,381 JLG members. Established 190 fodder demonstration plots and 190 vermi compost units, boosting farm yields and reducing costs.

Story of Change: Empowering Goat Rearing for Sustainable Livelihood

Monibai Valvi, a 62-year-old from Kakadkhunt, Nandurbar, saw significant improvements in her goat rearing through support from Yuva Mitra and Shabri Tribal Development Corporation. Despite no formal education, Monibai transformed her small herd of seven goats by receiving training, vaccination support, and access to a chaff cutter and quality fodder seeds. As a result, her goats became healthier and more productive. She sold two bucks for ₹11,000 and saw continuous breeding success. With improved practices, Monibai's income grew, highlighting how targeted support in rural areas can drive sustainable livelihood improvements. ■



Story of Change:Solar Irrigation System for

In Rojkund village, Lalsing Banda Vasave and four other farmers faced the burden of high irrigation costs, spending ₹700-1000 daily on diesel pumps. Seeking a sustainable

solution, the farmers approached the Lakhpati Kisan Project,

supported by Shabari Adivasi Vitta va Vikas Mahamandal Maryadit and implemented by Yuva Mitra. After a thorough site assessment, Yuva Mitra identified the beneficiaries and facilitated the installation of a solar irrigation system covering 5 acres of cotton fields. The system, costing ₹4,59,507, was mostly subsidized by Yuva Mitra, with the farmers contributing ₹30,000. The project had a significant impact, with each farmer saving ₹35,000 annually,

amounting to a total annual savings of ₹1,75,000. Moreover,

the solar-powered system boosted net profits per acre by

₹36,000, resulting in a collective profit increase of

₹1,80,000 for the farmers. This initiative not only reduced irrigation costs but also enhanced the economic well-being

of the farmers by promoting sustainable agricultural



Through the Lakhpati Kisan Project, I received valuable support that transformed my farming practices. With the resources and technical guidance provided, I was able to grow 2200 kg of sponge gourd, which earned me ₹88,000. After deducting the input cost of ₹17,000, 1 made a profit of ₹71,000. This experience has shown me the power of strategic farming and collaboration, and it has significantly improved my income and livelihood. I am grateful for the support and knowledge shared, and I now have more confidence in my agricultural future.



Through strategic partnerships and a commitment to sustainable development, Yuva Mitra has positively impacted the lives of thousands, fostering well-being and resilience in some of Maharashtra's most vulnerable populations.

Sukanya (Life Skill Development):

Yuva Mitra's Sukanya Program has been a pioneering initiative in life skill development for adolescent girls in rural Maharashtra. Launched with the support of HDFC Ltd. and Bosch Ltd., this program has been empowering young girls across Sinnar, Igatpuri, Nashik, and Trambak blocks of Nashik District since 2013. The core objective of the Sukanya Program is to equip adolescent girls with essential life skills, enabling them to navigate the challenges of adolescence with confidence and resilience.

Through this initiative, Yuva Mitra has provided life skill development training to over 34,344 girls across 294 schools, junior colleges, and ashram schools. The program addresses crucial topics such as physical and mental changes during adolescence, menstrual health, and decision-making, helping to dispel misconceptions and boost the girls' self-confidence.

We have also implemented the project in Mahad Block, Raigad District (Jul 2021-Mar 2023), and Palghar District (Jul 2019-Apr 2020), reaching over 7,347 students. The program focuses on career guidance, mental health, nutritional education, and policy advocacy, creating a platform for comprehensive adolescent development.

The Sukanya Program has also established a strong network of teachers and created innovative resources like the e-Sukanya website, helpline, and educational publications. These efforts have not only enhanced the girls' knowledge but have also fostered a supportive community that continues to uplift them.

MHM (Menstrual Health Management):

Yuva Mitra has emerged as a leader in Menstrual Health Management (MHM) across rural Maharashtra, addressing critical challenges faced by women and adolescent girls. Our MHM initiatives have reached over 23,980 women and 9,574 adolescent girls across 155 villages in Nashik, Pune, and Raigad Districts. By integrating MHM into broader health and education programs, Yuva Mitra focuses on breaking the stigma around menstruation, improving hygiene practices, and promoting awareness.

Our approach also includes training frontline workers and empowering local women to produce and distribute sanitary products, contributing to both health and economic development. Yuva Mitra's comprehensive strategy aligns with Sustainable Development Goals 3 (Good Health and Well-being) and 5 (Gender Equality), ensuring that women and girls can manage their menstrual health with dignity and confidence.

WASH: Water, Sanitation and Hygiene

Yuva Mitra's WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) initiative is dedicated to improving health and hygiene standards in rural schools across Maharashtra. Since its inception, the program has enhanced facilities in 75 schools, benefiting over 15,000 students. Funded by partners like TATA Autocomp Systems Limited, this initiative focuses on installing water purification systems, improving sanitation infrastructure, and promoting hygiene practices. By empowering schools and communities with the knowledge and tools for better hygiene, Yuva Mitra aligns with SDG 6 (Clean Water and Sanitation), creating healthier environments for students.



Barakhadi Program

The Barakhadi Program, funded by Piaggio Vehicles Pvt. Ltd, is a literacy and personality development initiative targeting school children in Baramati Block, Pune District. Running from 2020 to 2022, the program reached over 5,000 children annually across 54 ZP Schools. By making learning engaging and fun, Barakhadi successfully reduced dropout rates and fostered a love for reading, creativity, and curiosity. This initiative aligns with SDG 4 (Quality Education), enhancing students' educational experiences and overall development.




Arogya Mitra Program

WASH: The overall objective of this Program is to provide access to WASH facilities to 4000 Children across 20 Schools in selected areas of the Pune district of Maharashtra, To ensure that students inculcate appropriate hygienic Practices relating to WASH.

By increasing awareness, improving access to menstrual products, and reducing the stigma surrounding menstruation, the program seeks to empower women and girls with the knowledge and confidence to manage their



ACHIEVEMENTS

- Conducted menstrual hygiene awareness sessions for 430 women, 101 adolescent girls, and 106 adolescent boys.
- Trained **16 frontline workers** for community outreach.
- Provided affordable menstrual products.
- Enhanced sanitation infrastructure in schools.
- Engaged communities to reduce menstruation-related stigma.







Access to menstrual products improved

The Integrated Menstrual Hygiene Management Program has significantly impacted the community. Awareness and knowledge about menstrual hygiene improved, with 87% of respondents demonstrating better understanding and 92% of adolescent girls receiving education. Hygiene practices saw a positive shift, with 95% of respondents using hygienic menstrual products and 88% of women practicing proper menstrual hygiene management. Access to menstrual products improved, with 80% of adolescent girls reporting better access and 72% of respondents using reusable products. Sanitation facilities were enhanced, with 85% of respondents reporting better access to clean and private facilities and 90% of schools confirming adequate facilities for female students.

4 QUALITY FOLICATION **SUPPORTING SDGS**

The project initiated with a series of awareness campaigns across ten schools, targeting schoolgirls and female teachers. These sessions focused on the importance of menstrual health management, the use of clean menstrual products, and the harmful effects of poor hygiene practices. Approximately 2,337 beneficiaries gained essential knowledge and skills to manage their menstrual health. Additionally, training on operating and monitoring vending machines and disposal mechanisms was provided.





ACHIEVEMENT

The MHM program aims to improve menstrual health and hygiene in rural Maharashtra by raising awareness, providing access to affordable menstrual products, enhancing sanitation infrastructure, reducing stigma, and empowering women and girls to manage their menstrual health with confidence.

This innovative project supports several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), particularly those related to health, education, gender equality, and sustainable cities. By providing sustainable menstrual hygiene management solutions, the project contributes to SDG 3 (Good Health and Well-being), SDG 4 (Quality Education), SDG 5 (Gender Equality), and SDG 11 (Sustainable Cities and Communities).

In terms of waste management, PadCare's recycling system has collected and recycled a substantial amount of menstrual waste. For example, in the first month, 6.51 kg of waste was collected from the 10 schools, conserving 13.93 kg of CO2 equivalent and saving 130.2 liters of landfill space. In the coming year, the project aims to significantly expand its impact by further reducing waste, promoting the use of eco-friendly menstrual products, and continuing to educate and empower girls and women.

ACHIEVEMENTS OF MHM

- Distributed 13,000 sanitary pads to ensure access to affordable menstrual products.
- Conducted 10 training sessions for 900 adolescent girls on menstrual health sensitization and proper disposal.
- Installed 13 PadCare vending machines and 40 PadCare Bins to recycling of used sanitary pads.












INSTITUTION BUILDING AND SUSTAINABLE AGRICULTURE OVERVIEW

Yuva Mitra has established itself as a leader in promoting and developing Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs) across Maharashtra and beyond. Yuva Mitra's journey in promoting FPOs began in 2011 with the formation of the Devanadi Valley Agriculture Producers Company, uniting 556 farmers across 11 villages. This milestone set the foundation for Yuva Mitra's ongoing commitment to empowering small and marginal farmers through collective action and sustainable agriculture. Over the years, Yuva Mitra has achieved significant milestones.



With over 13 years of experience, Yuva Mitra has successfully registered 32 FPOs, including 9 under the Producer Organization Promoting Institution (POPI) scheme, 5 through the POPI-PODF ID initiative, 10 under the Central Sector Scheme for 10,000 FPOs (CBBO), and 6 private FPOs. Additionally, under the Lakhpati Kisan project, we have formed 2 FPOs in the Nandurbar district of Maharashtra, benefiting 450 shareholders. These initiatives have collectively empowered over 13,633 shareholders across 490+villages, providing small and marginal farmers with access to vital resources, market linkages, and sustainable agricultural practices.

BRLF Assignment:

In partnership with the Bharat Rural Livelihoods Foundation (BRLF), we have been involved in promoting education, training, research, and capacity building for rural livelihoods, with a focus on tribal and marginalized communities. Yuva Mitra has given the hand holding Support to 7 BRLF partners in Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujrat, Jharkhand, Odisha, Karnataka and West Bengal for FPO's training of BoDs, CEOs and staff of promoting institutions to facilitate the business development process.

BIRD Certificate Course:

As an Anchor Agency appointed by the Bankers Institute of Rural Development (BIRD), Yuva Mitra conducts a specialized 3-month certificate course for CEOs of FPOs, equipping them with the necessary skills to manage and scale their organizations effectively.

Formation of FPO in Punjab

Our work in Punjab, under the Integrated Livelihood Development Program in Kiratpur Sahib with NABARD's Value Chain project, has improved agricultural productivity and income for approximately 1,034 families, including 512 from SC/ST communities.



NABARD Partnerships:

Yuva Mitra has been recognized by NABARD as a key partner in promoting FPOs. As a Producer Organization Promoting Institution (POPI), Yuva Mitra has been instrumental in identifying, mobilizing, and supporting farmer clusters to form FPOs, ensuring they become economically viable and sustainable.

Empanelment with SFAC:

Yuva Mitra has been empaneled as a Resource Organization by the Small Farmers Agribusiness Consortium (SFAC), under the Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India. This recognition highlights Yuva Mitra's expertise in promoting FPOs across Maharashtra, fostering innovation, and creating sustainable agricultural ecosystems.



Producer Organization Promoting Institutes (POPIs)

Since 2016, Yuva Mitra has been designated by NABARD as a Producer Organization Promoting Institution (POPI) to promote FPOs. The role of POPIs is critical in creating a supportive environment for the formation and growth of FPOs by engaging with farmers at the grassroots level.

Impact: Today, Yuva Mitra has successfully registered around 14 FPOs in 4 blocks of Nashik district, providing ongoing support and guidance to these organizations. There are few best FPOs stands as a model of what can be achieved through collective action, with farmers now able to access larger markets and secure better prices for their produce.

Cluster-Based Business Organizations (CBBO)

Yuva Mitra's role extends beyond POPIs to include the formation and nurturing of Cluster-Based Business Organizations (CBBOs). These organizations are designed to scale up the impact of 10 FPOs with reaching shareholders by 3618 by creating a network of interconnected FPOs that can collaborate, share resources, and create value chains that enhance the profitability and sustainability of farming as a livelihood.

Resource Support Agency (RSA)

Yuva Mitra's expertise has been further recognized with its appointment as a Resource Support Agency (RSA) by NABARD. As an RSA, Yuva Mitra provides strategic support to other POPIs in Maharashtra, helping them to promote and develop FPOs more effectively.

By providing strategic support as a Resource Support Agency (RSA), Yuva Mitra continues to strengthen the capacity of other POPIs across Maharashtra, ensuring the long-term success and sustainability of FPOs in the region.

A Catalyst for Change

The Bamboo Cosmos FPC stands as a evidence to the power of innovation and willpower in the face of hard times. With 335 shareholders, this visionary enterprise has sown the seeds of economic prosperity by focusing exclusively on bamboo cultivation. Surgana Block, once known for its tribal heritage, is now a booming hub of agricultural productivity and sustainability, driven by the efforts of this FPC.

Bamboo Plantation: A Strategic Alliance for Success

Bamboo Cosmos leveraged strategic partnerships with the Atal Bamboo Samrudhi Yojana and the National Bamboo Mission, both sponsored by the Revenue and Forest Department of Maharashtra. These alliances enabled farmers to adopt bamboo cultivation at highly subsidized rates, providing significant savings for the beneficiaries.



- Engaged 12 local artisans and provided them with additional skills training to enhance their craft techniques.
- Participated in local exhibitions to showcase and sell bamboo products, generating ₹51,030 in sales revenue.
- The project realized a profit of ₹7,500, proving the economic viability of bamboo-based craftsmanship.




